This year's contest will continue to closely mimic the national contest, in the hopes of better preparing teams to compete at the national level, but will also help improve the employability of your students from the skills they learn. As in the past, only two teams per chapter will be allowed to compete in the contest.

Teams should consist of at least three members, one for each practicum. The practicums for 2026 are: *feature story, magazine layout and social media plan*

All practicums will be done using PC-based software. In 2026 students will be able to use the following programs to complete the practicums: Microsoft Office: Word and PowerPoint, Adobe PDF, Internet access to Qualtrics Survey, Canva (no templates allowed) adobe express. If you need an exception to bring a MAC please contact us.

Students will have computers available to use on site but may also bring their own computer with them if preferred. They will be required to use the computer to complete the required tests and the practicum. We want the practicum to be about the final product rather than the process. The files required for the contest will be provided in a google drive and a thumb drive if needed upon request. Students will be expected to save their work to the google drive and ensure the files are verified to be there before completing the competition.

To prepare Michigan's winning team for national competition, the CDE staff will be available to help the winning chapter develop a campaign throughout the summer and next fall. **Teams DO NOT need to prepare a campaign or presentation for the state competition.** All other rules and scorings will be exactly the same as those used in the National FFA CDE for broadcast, feature story, magazine layout and social media plan.
