VETERINARY SCIENCE

Career Development Event

PURPOSE

The purpose of the veterinary science CDE is to promote college and career readiness by providing students with opportunities to develop technical knowledge and demonstrate practical skills in the field of veterinary science.

TEAM MAKE-UP/ELIGIBILITY

All participants must be members in good standing with the Michigan FFA Association and on the official roster.

Equipment

Students are to **bring their own**:

- Pencils
- Clipboard
- Calculator

Dress Code

All participants must wear either scrubs (solid-color tops and bottoms) or business dress (no jeans with holes and a collared shirt).

CONTEST PERSONNEL

Judges

Judges will be selected by the contest superintendent.

Superintendent

The superintendent will monitor the contest room and assist the judges as they compile their scores.

The superintendent will adequately prepare the judges before the event competition.

PROCEDURE

Contest Procedures

The event will take approximately 3 to 3.5 hours.

Each student will complete four individual components including a) General Knowledge Exam, b) Breed Identification, c) Equipment, Tool and Parasite Identification, and d) a Practicum.

General Knowledge Exam

30 minutes | 100 points

50 multiple choice questions worth two points each. *Please see appendix for test bank of questions.*

Breed Identification

30 minutes | 100 points

Students must identify 50 breeds of animal taken from the breed list which will be presented to contestants to identify as photographs. Each breed identified will be worth two points.

Students will be provided the breed list during the competition & asked to place the number corresponding to a certain breed on the answer sheet. Breed identification slides will include the average size of the breed or species so that students will be able to accurately identify the animal from a picture. *Please see the appendix A for the breed list.*

Equipment, Tool and Parasite Identification

30 minutes | 100 points

Each student will identify 50 surgical & animal care equipment, tools, and parasites (adults &/or eggs). Each item identified will be worth two points.

Students will be provided an equipment list and a parasite list during competition & asked to place the number corresponding to a certain piece of equipment or parasite on the answer sheet.

Approximately 40 pieces of equipment from a list and 10 parasites from a list will be selected to correctly be identified either real items or photographs. *See appendix B and C.*

Practicums

30 minutes | 100 points

Each student will perform one of four practicums.

Practicums may be performing the skill or answering questions related to performing that skill (Example: properly filling a syringe & administering medication may be reading how much medication is in a syringe or if a medication is being administered using the right route rather than actually using a needle & syringe).

Practicums A, B, C and D will be completed by only one team member. Each team member will be assigned one of these 4 practicums. No two team members will complete the same practicum.

Students will need to prepare for all 4 practicums and will be told at check-in which one of the following practicums they will be doing:

- A. Patient History with filling out medical record & haltering with quick release knot – one team member *
- B. Set up a fecal flotation & microscope usage – one team member *
- C. Demonstrate a gauze muzzle application & properly filling a syringe & administering medication—one team member *
- D. Bandage removal & prescription pill filling – one team member *

SCORES

The individual score will be calculated as follows:

General Knowledge Exam	100 points
Breed Identification	100 points
Equipment, Tool and Parasite Identification	100 points
Practicum	100 points
Total	400 points

The team score will be calculated with all 4 scores counting as follows:

Individual A Score	400 points
Individual B Score	400 points
Individual C Score	400 points
Individual D Score	400 points
Total	1600 points

Determining Awards

Gold and Silver awards will be determined by the Michigan FFA Association Executive Secretary.

Tie Breaker

In event of an individual tie, the placing will be determined in the order of:

1. General knowledge exam score
2. Breed identification score
3. First practicum score
